## **Q301 - Rules of the Road: Inland**

**1. BOTH INTERNATIONAL & INLAND Which of the following is TRUE of a distress signal?**

- Is used to indicate doubt about another vessel's intentions
- Consists of 5 or more short blasts of the fog signal apparatus
- Consists of the raising and lowering of a large white flag
- **May be used separately or with other distress signals**

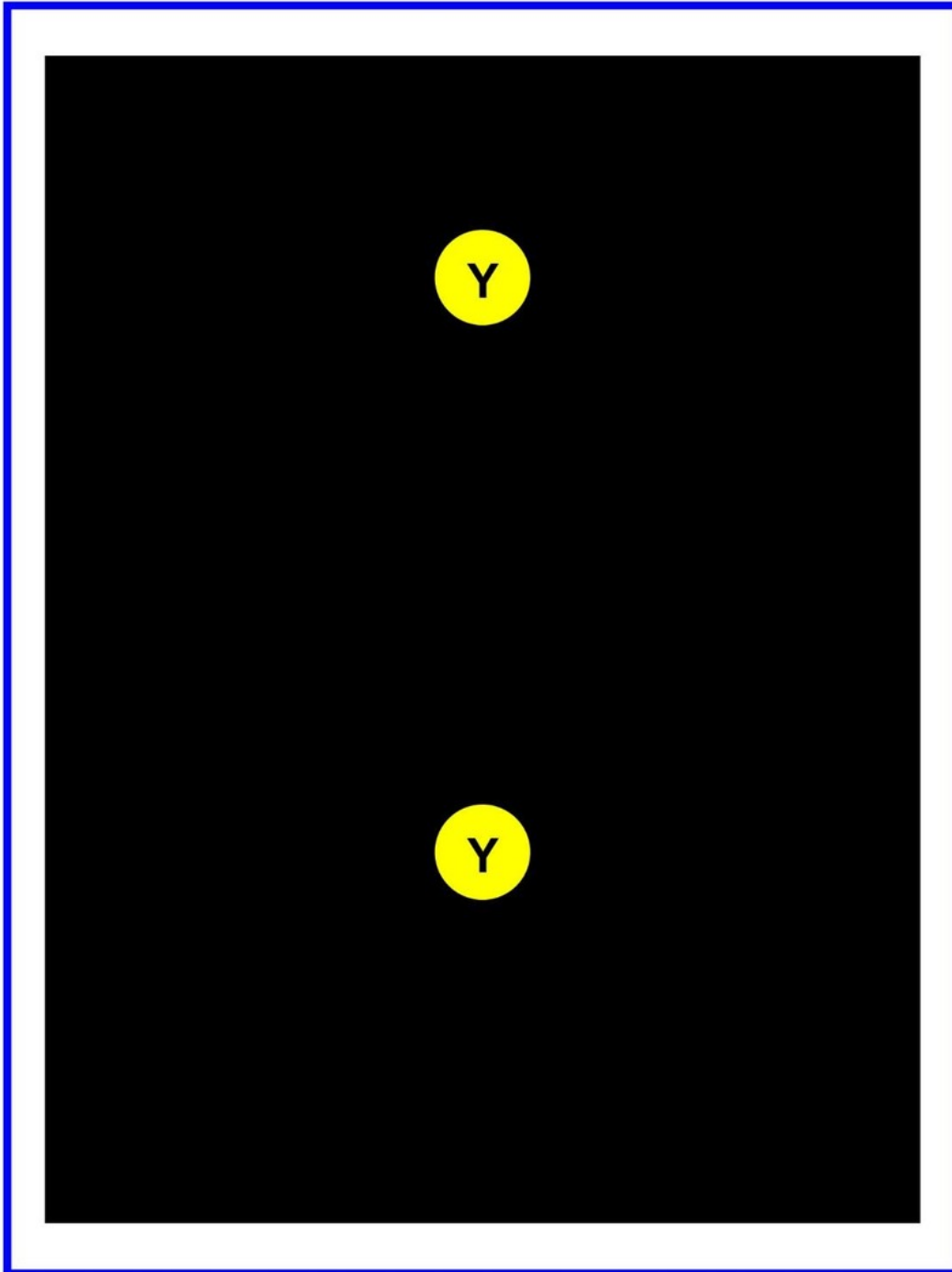
Note:

*Distress signals, as defined in Navigation Rules Annex IV, may be used independently or in conjunction with other signals to indicate a need for assistance.*

2. INLAND ONLY You are approaching a vessel displaying the lights as shown in illustration D075RR below. What type of situation is this?

## D075RR



- Crossing situation
- **Overtaking situation**
- Meeting head-on situation
- Special circumstance situation

Note:

*The vertical yellow lights indicate a stern towing arrangement, signifying you are approaching from behind. This scenario defines an overtaking situation as defined by Rule 13, making you the give-way vessel.*

**3. INLAND ONLY** You are crossing the course of another vessel which is to your starboard. You have reached an agreement by radiotelephone to pass astern of the other vessel. You MUST \_\_\_\_\_.

- sound one short blast
- sound two short blasts
- change course to starboard
- **None of the above**

Note:

*Having reached a radiotelephone agreement to pass astern of another vessel, no specific whistle signals or course changes are required under Inland Navigation Rules; therefore, none of the listed actions must be taken.*

---

**4. INLAND ONLY** Which of the following may be displayed by a commercial vessel engaged in public safety activities?

- flashing blue light
- **alternately flashing red and yellow light**
- alternately flashing blue and red light
- flashing yellow light

Note:

*Vessels engaged in public safety activities inland may display an alternately flashing red and yellow light signal as specified in 33 CFR 88.12.*

---

**5. INLAND ONLY** Which of the following may be displayed by a law enforcement boat?

- flashing red light
- flashing amber light
- **flashing blue light**
- blue flag

Note:

*Law enforcement vessels operating inland may display a flashing blue light as specified in 33 CFR 88.11; other options are not authorized signals under the Inland Navigation Rules.*

---

**6. INLAND ONLY** Which of the following signals may be exhibited by a vessel trawling in close proximity to other fishing vessels?

- A red light over a white light in a vertical line
- **Two white lights in a vertical line**
- Two fixed yellow lights in a vertical line
- All of the above

Note:

*A vessel trawling in close proximity to other fishing vessels may exhibit two white lights in a vertical line as a special optional signal, as permitted by Inland Navigation Rules.*

---

**7. INLAND ONLY Under the Inland Navigation Rules, what is the meaning of a one short blast signal used when meeting another vessel?**

- "I am turning to starboard."
- "I am turning to port."
- "I intend to leave you on my starboard side."
- **"I intend to leave you on my port side."**

Note:

*According to Inland Navigation Rule 34(a), a single short blast signal indicates the intention to leave another vessel on your port side when meeting.*

---

**8. INLAND ONLY A law enforcement vessel patrolling a marine regatta may exhibit a flashing blue light or which of the following alternates?**

- **an alternately flashing red and yellow light**
- a high intensity flashing white light (strobe)
- two amber lights in a horizontal line
- a fixed green light over a red flashing light

Note:

*33 CFR 88 allows law enforcement vessels patrolling marine regattas to display an alternately flashing red and yellow light as an alternative to a flashing blue light.*

---

**9. INLAND ONLY Which light(s) are permitted ONLY for law enforcement vessels?**

- two red lights in a vertical line
- **a flashing blue light**
- an alternately flashing red and yellow light
- a flashing yellow light

Note:

*Only law enforcement vessels are authorized to display a flashing blue light under the Inland Navigation Rules; this is exclusive to law enforcement vessels as defined in 33 CFR 88.11 and is not permitted for vessels not under command, public safety vessels, or air-cushion vessels.*

---

**10. INLAND ONLY Maneuvering signals shall be sounded on inland waters by \_\_\_\_\_.**

- all vessels when meeting, crossing, or overtaking and in sight of one another
- **power-driven vessels overtaking and in sight of one another**
- power-driven vessels crossing at a distance within half a mile of each other and NOT in sight of one another
- all vessels meeting or crossing at a distance within half a mile of each other and not in sight of one another

Note:

*Inland Rule 34 requires power-driven vessels in sight of one another to sound maneuvering signals when overtaking.*

---
